



What's coming to Tin City?

There has been a lot of speculation about what is coming to the Tin City area of Wallace.

A strip center is under construction between the Realo Drug Store and Sensations Restaurant. The initial plans included a drive through window on one space of the building, but there is no formal announcement of a tenant for that space.

Across the street, the same developer is planning a car wash and and fast service oil change.

The Tin City Convenience location has been purchased by Royal Farms to build one of their "World Famous Chicken and Fresh Kitchen"

convenience/ food/gas complexes. This will be similar to the Kinston location opening soon on W Vernon Ave.

change.You can find more photos of the Kinston store on Mayor Don D. Hardy's Facebook page. Wallace Planning Director Rod Fritz expects the Wallace location to be operational in 2025.

There is also a housing development planned across from Walmart that will extend from Hwy 41 through to Hwy 11. Plans to finish building out the Eastwood Acres subdivision are also in the works. There is another housing development planned for Hwy 11 south of Wallace Elementary School.

Public Services in action

Public Services Director Brent Dean explained why paving Harrell St. took Public Services loner that expected - it had an issue- when it was milled it down there was no sub base under the asphalt, just dirt. Almost 20 inches of rain in the next 20 days made things worse. Almost 80 tons of stone were brought in to wedge the road before paving. Brent says Medical Village Dr. is next up, and plans to get that milled on the weekend to not impact the businesses there. There is a list of potholes to be paved all around town as well.

The Rockfish Creek restoration project begins this month, and the Currie St. ditch project has started. That will help stop the erosion of the open storm drain ditch that runs from South Teachey St. to Currie St. There are also well projects under construction. They are being completed by DPH.

Work has begun on the water asset inventory that the town received a grant for. This will map our water system which will then be put in a digital format for easier access and accuracy. The Storm water mapping project is almost complete, it was also funded by a grant.

The Railroad Crossing signals on Main Street are scheduled to be removed by DOT.

Wallace has hired an animal control contractor. People may see him setting traps to help control the cat and dog population problem we have in town. We will not be holding animals, they will go straight to Kenansville.

From the Mayor's Desk

The town has been active in many ongoing projects. In addition to road projects and drainage maintenance, we are pleased to introduce "Libby" an online library of books and audio files available from the Thelma Dingus Bryant Library.

There has been a lot of activity at Farrior Park at the Boney Mill Pond, including the installation of new playground equipment and installation of the Dog Park.

We have had several ribbon cuttings for new businesses recently, from the new Ollie's on Highway 117 and Wendy's on Highway 41 to One Eleven Mane on W. Main St.

We have also been wrapping up ease-

ments for sewer lines that will be key to the town's future growth.

"Downtown Get Down", a fall concert on October 28th is being pre-sented at the Wallace Train Depot will feature the band North Tower. The event will be from 6 to 10 PM at the Wallace Train Depot and will feature both music and food trucks. This is a great new fall event leading into the upcoming holiday season.
