
Get Down Downtown at the Depot


The Learning Station at the Depot will be open with lots of activities, including the ride'em Thomas the Train and interactive train table. There are books and activity sheets and more every month at this event!





Political Yard Signs

Please be aware of the ordinances in town for yard signs being posted in yards and in the right of way. If you are planning to place a yard sign for a business or event, please contact Rod Fritz in the Planning Department at 910-285-4136 for information and code guidelines.

Understand that signs not having prior approval or meeting town guidelines are subject to removal by the Code Enforcement Officer.

Political campaign signs are permitted in the right of way for 30 days prior to election day, and must be removed by 30 days after the election.

From the Town Manager

The Town of Wallace has been working on updating the branding for the Town. The current town seal will continue to be used on official documents, but its intricacy does not work well for other uses.
