# David Jordan honored by street naming in Wallace



Many of you may be familiar with or have heard of David Jordan, who passed away in March 2021. Mr. Jordan dedicated close to 40 years of service as a council member for the Town of Wallace, with 31 of those years served as Mayor Pro Tem. Additionally, he proudly served as a US Army veteran and devoted his life to education.

Throughout his 30-year teaching career, he held positions such as assistant principal at Wallace-Rose Hill High School and ultimately retired as principal at Charity Middle School. Mr. Jordan's commitment extended beyond the classroom, as he spent 28 years on the Board of Trustees for James Sprunt Community College. He exemplified care and dedication in all aspects of his life, serving his profession, family, community, and faith.



In recognition of his steadfast dedication to the community, the Town Council of Wallace honored his memory by renaming Powell Street, where Mr. Jordan and his wife Nancy resided to Jordan Street. We hope you will support our effort in honoring David and the enduring impact he made on our community, both Wallace and Duplin County.

A ceremony to celebrate the street being re-named was held March 15 at the cross-

Nancy Jordan road of North Graham St, and Jordan St. The event was attended by Nancy Jordan and many members of the Jordan family.

Wallace Mayor Jason Wells commented on the effect Mr. Jordan had on his life, both as a student at Charity Middle School, and as a young Wallace Town Council member. He explained that Mr. Jordan was "near and dear" to him when he first came on the board and explained things he did not understand.

Former Mayor Charley Farrior commented that "David was his friend, a good friend", and commented that David was a good council member and very good Mayor Pro-Tem. Farrior called David his right hand man, adding that he could always count on him.

The new street sign was unveiled At the end of remarks by family and friends of David Jordan who were in attendance at the event.

The architect working on the design for the Inclusive Playground at Clement Park developed four designs to consider. The Parks and Recreation staff and board have been involved in developing the plans.

The town is applying for a PARTF grant in early May to assist with implementing the plans and begin construction.

The first phase will build the inclusive playground that has been in planning for several years.

Additional plans call for new and relo-

cated tennis courts, splash pad, updated sidewalks and parking. Currently the Clement Park Community Center is being renovated that will provide future meeting rooms for non profits, like the cub scouts as well as additional recreational classes like karate, Pilates and ceramics.

The Ribbon Cutting for Farrior Park at the Boney Mill Pond is sceduled for April 18 at 1:00 pm. The park has a kayak launch, a fishing pier and a Kids Track Trail and a playground with a covered picnic area, restroom facilities and permanent cornhole

boards and a dog park.

The park's Track Trail offers adventures for kids to follow on the 1.5 mile walking trail. They can choose to find things in the natural setting, or an athletic walk where they can act like the animals.

Prompts include hopping like a frog or flapping their arms like a hummingbird as they walk around the trail around a pond.

The track trail is part of the Kids in Parks program in association with the National Parks Service. To find all the adventures available go to the *kids in parks.com* and enter Wallace, NC.

Work has begun to restore the Boney Mill Pond grist mill. This is one of the few remaining mills, and the hope is to be able to restore it to be operational.
